The Seasonal School in Gender Studies and Feminist Theory combines different perspectives from the social sciences to provide participants with tools to address the main dimensions of gender studies and feminist theory from an epistemological, political-legal and philosophical-political perspective.

The training programme will provide a theoretical-political framework on the contribution of gender studies and feminisms in the social sciences while engaging participants to reflect on global and intersectional perspectives, as well as on the impact of public policies on everyday challenges including: structural gender-based violence, the dimension of reproductive rights and justice, and the emerging of situated needs for different subjectivities in public and collective space.

Theoretical lectures will be supported by workshops and interactive activities organized in collaboration with civil society organisations, GBV centers and feminist networks.
